Notable Cases

On Wednesday, 10-01-14 at 8:32 p.m., San Francisco Police Department requested our officers to respond to Seton Hospital to detain a shooting victim/suspect who had been shot in the abdomen. (The incident occurred near Candlestick Park.) The subject who drove the victim/suspect was also detained. The San Francisco Police Department did not request any further assistance from us.

On Thursday, 10-02-14 at 11:09 a.m., Officer Richard Woodworth was conducting a speed enforcement detail on Lake Merced Boulevard near Glenwood Avenue when he heard two vehicles traveling at a high rate of speed. Officer Jason Craig was nearby and stopped both of the vehicles. Officer Craig smelled marijuana coming from one vehicle. The officer asked the driver to step out of the vehicle, and when he was asked if he had anything illegal or sharp on him, he said he had a .38 revolver in his pants. The subject, a 23-year old San Francisco resident, said he sometimes carries a large sum of money and he needed the gun for protection. The subject was arrested for possession of a firearm in public, possession of less than an ounce of marijuana in a vehicle and for driving at an unsafe speed.

On Thursday, 10-02-14 at 2:52 p.m., Officer Isaako Poti and Officer Lilian Tashiro conducted a pedestrian stop on a male subject riding a skateboard at the intersection of Oriente Street and Otilia Street for riding the skateboard in an illegal and unsafe manner by crossing all lanes of traffic. The subject, a 17-year old Daly City resident, allowed the officer to search his person and backpack. Officer Poti asked the subject if he had anything illegal on him, and he admitted to having "weed" in his backpack. The subject had a pocket knife in his front pocket and a baggie containing marijuana in the backpack. In addition to that, the officer also found a black marker in the backpack. The backpack had multiple graffiti-like drawings on it, and the officer asked the subject what he used the marker for. The subject said he used it for calligraphy. After further investigation, officers determined that the subject was responsible for various graffiti drawn onto public signs and buildings along Geneva Avenue. The officers have a requested a complaint be sought for vandalism.

On Friday, 10-03-14 at 7:08 p.m., Sergeant Mike Brennan stopped a vehicle at Sullivan Avenue and San Fernando Way for expired registration. Sgt. Brennan smelled an odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle and noticed the subject was extremely nervous. Sgt. Brennan asked the subject if he could search the vehicle, and the subject consented. Sgt. Brennan found a large amount of marijuana in the vehicle, and the subject admitted that he sold the marijuana. The subject, a 21-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for possession of marijuana for sale.

On Saturday, 10-04-14 at 9:17 p.m., Officer Kelly Lemere stopped a vehicle for a brake light violation in the parking lot of Walgreen's on San Pedro Road. When the officer contacted the driver, she smelled an odor of marijuana emanating from the vehicle. The passenger, a 25-year old Daly City resident, advised that he had a medical marijuana card. Dispatchers advised that the subject was on probation for health and safety violations and was subject to search and seizure. The officer asked the subject if he had anything illegal on him, and the subject gave an ambiguous response and hesitated answering. He then put his hands over his head and said, "I'll let you grab it." The officer immediately grabbed a loaded handgun out of the subject's waistband. The vehicle was searched with the assistance of a K-9, and the officers located various controlled substances (pills). The subject was arrested for carrying a loaded firearm on his person in a public place (with priors), carrying a concealed weapon on his person (with priors), carrying a loaded concealed weapon and for possession of controlled substances.

On Sunday, 10-05-14 at 1:40 p.m., Officer Lee Aquila conducted a pedestrian stop at the corner of Allen Street and Geneva Avenue. Officer Aquila found an 8" paring knife concealed between a pair of shorts and his stomach, underneath the subject's tee shirt. The subject, a 22-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for possession of a dirk or a dagger. The subject was recently released from prison in late June.

Daly City Council Adopts Urgency Ordinance to Regulate Outdoor Water Use

On August 11, the City Council adopted an urgency ordinance regulating outdoor water use to conform with the emergency drought regulations recently adopted by the State Water Resources Control Board. Daly City's urgency ordinance prohibits residents from:

- Washing down driveways and sidewalks.
- Watering outdoor landscapes that cause visible runoff.
- Using a hose to wash an automobile, unless the hose is fitted with a shut-off nozzle.
- Using potable water in non-recirculated ornamental fountains.

In addition, outdoor irrigation is prohibited between the hours of 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and limited to no more than two days per week (Sunday through Saturday)

Violations of the ordinance will result in a documented issuance of a written warning notice. If violations continue, then fines starting at \$250 with a maximum of \$1,000 may be issued per violation.

If residents observe water leaks or have concerns about non-essential water use, please contact the City 24-hours a day at (650) 991-8200.
