When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 06-21-16 at approximately 11:23 a.m., several officers were dispatched to the 900 block of **Brunswick Street** on a report of a potential in-progress auto burglary. The witness described the subjects to the officers, and the officers contacted subjects nearby who matched the description. Two subjects, a 16-year old Daly City resident and a 13-year old San Francisco resident, were arrested for burglary and attempted auto theft.

On Friday, 06-24-16 at approximately 3:21 a.m., Officer B. Shiu was dispatched to the area of **Sullivan Avenue** and **87th Street** on a report of a man down. The reporting party said he was driving by and he saw a man on the ground. He got out of his car to check on him and found that he was having a seizure. The Fire Department and paramedics treated the 41-year old Daly City resident who didn't remember what happened and transported him to Seton Hospital.

On Saturday, 06-25-16 at 3:34 a.m., Officer Chittenden was dispatched to the area of **Polaris Way** and **Canyon Drive** on a report of a female lying in the middle of the street screaming. The officer arrived to find a male and female next to a vehicle on the 200 block of Polaris Way. The female, a 30-year old Daly City resident, said she was having a panic attack and would not answer any of the officer's questions. The officer smelled a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on her breath and person. The male subject said the female was his girlfriend and they had been arguing about their relationship and did not want to go into any further details. The officer observed that the male subject, a 30-year old South San Francisco resident, was under the influence of alcohol. Both of the subjects were subsequently arrested for disorderly conduct as they were too drunk to care for themselves.

On Sunday, 06-26-16 at 12:47 a.m., Officer McQuade was dispatched to a residence on the unit block of **Eastwood Avenue** on a report of a loud and unruly house party. The officer saw approximately 10-15 subjects holding red plastic cups standing in the driveway and porch area, and he heard loud hip-hop music. As he walked closer to the residence, he heard someone yell from a microphone from within the residence that the “cops are here!” and to keep it down. The officer contacted a subject who said they were having a party for his 21st birthday, and the subject estimated there were 40-50 people inside the residence. The officer asked to speak with the homeowner, and the homeowner agreed that it was too noisy. Cover officers responded to assist in closing down the party. Two subjects, 25-year

olds from Oakland and San Francisco, started causing a disturbance and were ultimately arrested for resisting, obstructing and/or delaying a police officer when they refused to leave the party. The 49-year old homeowner was arrested for contributing to the delinquency of a minor for providing alcoholic beverages to underage party goers.

Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Tuesday, 06-21-16 at 12:37 a.m., the Walgreen's store at **Westlake Shopping Center** and a store clerk were the victims of a robbery and brandishing of a knife by an unknown suspect who pulled a knife from his pocket after being confronted by the manager for stealing a pair of headphones. The victim described the suspect as a black male between 25-30 years old, 5'9", with a slim build, approximately 130 pounds, wearing a red baseball cap, dark denim jacket, black jeans and a black backpack. This case has been referred to investigators. The 59-year old clerk was unharmed.

On Tuesday, 06-21-16 at 8:19 p.m., a gas station on **John Daly Boulevard** and a 19-year old clerk were the victims of a robbery by an unknown suspect who displayed a handgun at the clerk and demanded money. The clerk gave the suspect money, and the suspect demanded to check the till for other cash before leaving on foot. The suspect was described as a Hispanic male, early 20's, 5'7, skinny, goatee, dark eyes and was last seen wearing a black jacket with a hood, white pants and a black backpack. The clerk was unharmed. This case has been referred to investigators. Perhaps you can help identify the suspect. Here is a photo of him:



Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary and one attempted residential burglary during the past week.

On Thursday, 06-23-16 between 5:30 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., an unknown suspect pried the front door to an apartment on the 300 block of **Philip Drive** and stole two televisions, an iPad, three pairs of headphones, speakers, a carbon monoxide detector, nest camera and a thermostat.

On Thursday, 06-23-16 at approximately 11:28 a.m., a resident on the 800 block of **King Drive** called to report an unknown subject was trying to break into the rear window of her home. The resident told the officers that about 20 minutes prior to hearing the glass break, she said an unknown subject rang the doorbell approximately three times, but she did not answer the door. After she heard the glass breaking, the victim ran to the sliding door and yelled at the suspect to stay away and then called the police. Officers searched the area but could not locate anyone. There is no description of the subject.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

On Wednesday, 06-22-16 at approximately 3:06 a.m., two unknown suspects pried the front door of the My Wireless store at **Skyline Plaza** and took electronics and cash. The first suspect is described as a Hispanic or Samoan male, 6' tall, heavy set, wearing a gray hooded sweater, dark mask, blue pants and black gloves. The second suspect was described as a black male, 6' tall, heavy set, wearing a black hooded sweater, red shirt, light colored pants and blue gloves.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were four vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot (near Macy's)—two shopping bags were taken from a 2009 Dodge Journey. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 06-20-16 between 1:15 p.m. and 2:45 p.m. The bags were found nearby.
- 100 block of **South Mayfair Avenue**—a backpack containing a Microsoft laptop was taken from a 2013 Honda Insight. The trunk window was smashed. Occurred between 10:00 p.m. on 06-22-16 and midnight on 06-23-16.
- **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot near Buffalo Wild Wings—a backpack containing an Apple MacBook Pro, checkbook, hard drive, Kindle e-reader, identification cards and another backpack containing a hard drive, laptop charger, cell phone charger, sunglasses, keys, water bottle, headphones and a notebook were taken from a 2016 Tesla Model S. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 06-24-16 between 9:30 p.m. and 10:30 p.m.
- **City Toyota** parking lot—a lockbox was taken off of a 2016 Toyota RAV4. Occurred on 06-26-16 at 9:30 p.m.

Stolen Vehicles

There four vehicles stolen and two attempted stolen vehicles during the past week. Two of them were recovered, and three people were arrested.

- 800 block of **Schwerin Street**—a 1988 BMW 735i. Occurred on 06-21-16 at 7:54 a.m. **Recovered by the San Mateo County S.O. on 06-26-16.
- 300 block of **Accacia Street**—a 2006 Honda Accord. Occurred between 8:00 p.m. on 06-20-16 and 7:00 a.m. on 06-21-16. **Recovered by Daly City P.D. on 06-26-16.
- 300 block of **Santa Barbara Avenue**—a 2015 Smart car. Occurred on 06-23-16 between 10:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m.
- 700 block of **Gellert Boulevard**—a 1997 Honda Accord. Occurred between 5:00 p.m. on 06-23-16 and 12:00 p.m. on 06-24-16.
- **Brunswick Street/Irvington Street**—an attempt only to a 1997 Toyota Corolla. Two juvenile suspects were arrested. Occurred on 06-21-16 at 11:20 a.m.
- **City Toyota** parking lot—an attempted only to a 2016 Toyota Highlander. A 46-year old transient was arrested. Occurred on 06-21-16 at 4:28 p.m.

Fireworks in Daly City

Fireworks are illegal in Daly City. This includes the “safe and sane” types that are sold in nearby cities. On the days leading up to each 4th of July, as well as the actual day and after, fireworks are one of the biggest causes of fires and injuries throughout the United States. Let’s keep our City safe and free from any potential disasters. The Daly City Police Department personnel will be on heightened patrol looking for people using fireworks. People in possession of or using any fireworks will be subject to a citation/arrest by an officer. This includes fireworks that are purchased from another city. In California, it is a misdemeanor to possess illegal fireworks. This could be punishable by a fine of not less than \$500, and no more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment in a county jail for up to one year. The Daly City Police Department takes this very seriously. In addition, parents may be held liable for any damages or injuries caused by their children’s use of illegal fireworks.
