Robberies

There was one robbery during the past week.

On Wednesday, 08-28-24, at approximately 6:45 p.m., three suspects entered **LensCrafters** located inside Macy’s at the **Serramonte Center** and stole approximately \$15,000 worth of eyeglass frames from the displays. An employee stated that the suspects entered the store, took eyeglass frames, and exited. Approximately two minutes later, the suspects reentered the store, pushed the employee, took additional eyeglass frames, and left again. The suspects fled in a gray Honda CRV.

Residential Burglaries

There were no residential burglaries during the past week.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

Between Friday, 08-30-24, at approximately 6:30 p.m. and Saturday, 08-31-24, at approximately 8:10 a.m., **13Gallons**, a screen printing and embroidery shop located on the 6200 block of **Mission Street**, was burglarized. Unknown suspect(s) forced entry through the front door and stole a gaming console valued at \$500.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were two vehicle burglaries during the past week.

This private network ensures that only those who live in your neighborhood can join; users must go through a verification process. Please note: The City of Daly City and/or the Police Department cannot see what residents post—we are only allowed to post information.
