When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Thursday, 07-10-25, at approximately 12:13 p.m., officers were dispatched to **Safeway** at the **Westlake Shopping Center** on a report of a disturbance. A security guard stated that the suspect entered the store, selected coffee products, kicked open a security gate to bypass closed registers, and walked toward the exit doors. The security guard followed the suspect until the suspect stopped approximately seven feet from the exit and held a glass bottle over his head, motioning as if he were going to throw it at the security guard. The security guard felt fear when this happened. The security guard attempted to pepper spray the suspect but was unsuccessful. The suspect then continued toward the exit and again raised the glass bottle. The security guard pepper sprayed the suspect as he threw the glass bottle at him and fled the store. Officers located the suspect at the intersection of South Mayfair Avenue and Fairway Drive. The security guard positively identified the suspect. The suspect, a 31-year-old Los Angeles resident, was arrested and booked into jail for robbery.

On Thursday, 07-10-25, at approximately 11:39 p.m., officers were dispatched to **Allemany Street** and **San Pedro Road** on a report of a man down in the street. The victim stated that as he was walking home, he was suddenly punched in the back of the head and fell to the ground. While the victim was on the ground, he was kicked in the stomach and cut, possibly with a knife. The victim believed there were two suspects. The suspects stole the victim's wallet, which contained \$200 and a debit card. A witness described the two possible suspects as males of average build, approximately 5'9" to 5'10" tall, both wearing black or dark-colored hoodies with the hoods up, and dark-colored blue jeans.

Residential Burglaries

There were two residential burglaries during the past week.

On Thursday, 07-10-25, between 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m., a known suspect entered a residence on the unit block of **Tallwood Drive** and stole a wallet containing \$300, a key fob, and a 2007 Mercedes-Benz E350. Later that day, the known suspect returned the vehicle. Officers arrested the suspect, a 31-year-old Sacramento resident, for residential burglary, vehicle theft, and outstanding warrants.

On Friday, 07-11-25, between approximately 3:27 a.m. and 3:34 a.m., two unknown suspects entered two apartment buildings on the 800 block of **Campus Drive** and stole mail from multiple mailboxes. The first suspect was described as a bald, light-complexioned male wearing a red hooded sweatshirt, black sweatpants, white shoes, glasses, and a black face mask. The second suspect was described as a light-complexioned male wearing a black baseball hat, a white T-shirt, black pants with white stripes, black shoes with white soles, a black face mask, and carrying a gray backpack.

Commercial Burglaries

There were no commercial burglaries during the past week.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were no vehicle burglaries during the past week.

Stolen Vehicles

There were four stolen vehicles during the past week. Four vehicles were recovered.

- Unit block of **Tallwood Drive**—a theft of a 2007 **Mercedez-Benz E350**. Occurred on 07-10-25 between 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. The known suspect returned the vehicle on 07-10-25. This is the same vehicle mentioned in the Residential Burglaries section above.
- **Chester Street** and **Lisbon Street**—a theft of a 2007 **Infiniti G35**. Occurred between 5:00 p.m. on 07-11-25 and 10:10 p.m. on 07-13-25. **Recovered by Oakland PD on 07-15-25.
- **Parkview Avenue** and **Mission Street**—a theft of a 2016 **Maserati Ghibli**. Occurred between 10:00 a.m. on 07-13-25 and 9:00 a.m. on 07-14-25. **Recovered by SFPD on 07-14-25.
- **Templeton Avenue** and **Hanover Street**—a theft of a 2011 **Infiniti Q70**. Occurred on 07-13-25 between 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. **Recovered by DCPD on 07-13-25.

Miscellaneous

- There were 130 cases taken.
- There were 13 domestic disturbance cases reported.
- There were 3 cases involving an involuntary psychiatric hold.
- There were 4 malicious mischief/vandalism cases reported.
- There were 7 cases for public intoxication.

- There were 3 hit-and-run collisions reported.
- There were 2 narcotics-related cases taken.

This alert is a free digital communication system used by emergency management agencies and first responders to send emergency alerts, notifications, and updates to portable digital devices. In an emergency situation, an alert will be sent by San Mateo County authorized personnel, and you will receive messages on your cell phone or mobile device. This private network ensures that only those who live in your neighborhood can join; users must go through a verification process. Neighbors ask each other for business recommendations; help in locating missing pets; discuss relevant local government issues; or connect for other reasons. It is very easy to sign up. I like the fact that the site verifies users by addresses, and it won't allow people to access a neighborhood if they don't live there. Please note: The City of Daly City and/or the Police Department cannot see what residents post—we are only allowed to post information.
