When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Tuesday, 12-09-25, at approximately 7:43 a.m., a victim was robbed near the unit block of **Vendome Avenue** by two unknown suspects. The victim stated that the suspects snatched her purse from her shoulder. The purse contained cash, a workers permit, and a Department of Health and Human Services card. The victim described the first suspect as a tall male wearing a beanie and a dark-colored jacket. The second suspect was described as a tall male wearing a big jacket.

On Wednesday, 12-10-25, at approximately 10:58 a.m., officers were dispatched to a robbery near the intersection of **Miriam Street** and **Vista Grande Avenue**. The victim stated that while she was walking, she noticed a brown vehicle driving behind her. When the victim looked toward the vehicle, the driver bent down in an attempt to conceal his identity. Another suspect exited the vehicle and approached the victim, instructing her to remove her jewelry and give the suspect everything. The suspect then forcefully removed the victim's gold chain and gold earrings. The suspect handed the victim fake jewelry wrapped in a paper towel before reentering the vehicle, which then drove away. The victim described the driver as a Filipino male and the suspect who took the jewelry as a Filipino female with short hair, approximately in her 20s to 30s, wearing a light brown crop top.

Residential Burglaries

There were two residential burglaries during the past week.

On Friday, 12-12-25, between 10:00 a.m. and 1:30 p.m., a residence on the 300 block of **Oriente Street** was burglarized by an unknown suspect, who stole jewelry and cash. The resident discovered a rear window open and the window screen on the floor.

On Friday, 12-12-25, between 11:30 a.m. and 7:15 p.m., a residence on the unit block of **Belmont Drive** was burglarized by unknown suspect(s). The suspect(s) stole jewelry, watches, cash, an identification card, and a camera. The residents discovered that a kitchen window had been broken and the interior garage door was open. This investigation is ongoing.

Commercial Burglaries

There were no commercial burglaries during the past week.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were two vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- 200 block of **Avalon Drive**—a radar detector was taken from a 2017 **Audi S5**. The passenger window was broken. Occurred on 12-11-25 at approximately 5:47 a.m.
- 200 block of **Avalon Drive**—nothing was taken from a 2018 **Lexus GX460**. The rear window was broken. Occurred on 12-11-25 at approximately 5:47 a.m.

Stolen Vehicles

There were no stolen vehicles during the past week.

Have you signed up to receive these alerts? This alert is a free digital communication system used by emergency management agencies and first responders to send emergency alerts, notifications, and updates to portable digital devices. In an emergency situation, an alert will be sent by San Mateo County authorized personnel, and you will receive messages on your cell phone or mobile device. Nextdoor.com is a free private social networking website for your neighborhood. This private network ensures that only those who live in your neighborhood can join; users must go through a verification process. Neighbors ask each other for business recommendations; help in locating missing pets; discuss relevant local government issues; or connect for other reasons. It is very easy to sign up. I like the fact that the site verifies users by addresses, and it won't allow people to access a neighborhood if they don't live there. Please note: The City of Daly City and/or the Police Department cannot see what residents post—we are only allowed to post information.
