When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Robberies

There was one robbery and one attempted robbery during the past week.

On Sunday, 01-25-26, at approximately 11:00 p.m., a victim was walking on the 5900 block of **Mission Street** when he was approached by two suspects. One suspect asked the victim for money, after which the victim was struck on the head with a stick. The suspects stole the victim’s red backpack containing cell phones, a pendant, and sunglasses. The suspects then fled northbound on Mission Street. The victim described one suspect as a Black male in his mid-twenties wearing a red hoodie and black pants. The second suspect was described as a Black male in his mid-twenties wearing a black hoodie and brown pants. This investigation is ongoing.

On Sunday, 01-25-26, at approximately 9:58 p.m., officers were dispatched to the 3200 block of **Geneva Avenue** on a call for service. The victim stated that he was there to meet a female and was subsequently assaulted by a male suspect with a glass bottle. Both the female and male suspects fled in a vehicle. Officers later located the suspects and detained them.

This alert is a free digital communication system used by emergency management agencies and first responders to send emergency alerts, notifications, and updates to portable digital devices. In an emergency situation, an alert will be sent by San Mateo County authorized personnel, and you will receive messages on your cell phone or mobile device. Most carriers activate the service automatically. To receive emergency alerts, sign up by visiting www.smcalert.info.

Nextdoor.com is a free private social networking website for your neighborhood. This private network ensures that only those who live in your neighborhood can join; users must go through a verification process. Neighbors ask each other for business recommendations; help in locating missing pets; discuss relevant local government issues; or connect for other reasons. It is very easy to sign up. that the site verifies users by addresses, and it won't allow people to access a neighborhood if they don't live there. Please note: The City of Daly City and/or the Police Department cannot see what residents post—we are only allowed to post information.
