When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Friday, 11-20-20 at 3:38 a.m., **Officer Reininger** checked on a parked vehicle with a driver sleeping in it at the **Arco** gas station parking lot on **Mission Street**. The officer ran the license plate and found that the vehicle was stolen from San Francisco. **Officer Wagnon** responded to assist, and they could see a firearm and a ski mask on the lap of the subject sleeping in the driver’s seat. The officers woke up the subject, a 34-year old Daly City resident, and subsequently arrested him for vehicle theft, possession of a stolen vehicle, possession of a loaded and concealed firearm in a vehicle, and possession of narcotics paraphernalia.

On Sunday, 11-22-20 at approximately 1:49 a.m., subsequent to a traffic stop by **Officer Todaro** on the 6900 block of **Mission Street**, a 33-year old San Francisco resident was arrested for possession of controlled substances (Xanax, MDMA, methamphetamine, and heroin) for sale. His 32-year old passenger gave false identifying information to the officer, and he was arrested for a warrant and for giving false information to a peace officer.

Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

Between Sunday, 11-22-20 at 12:00 p.m. and Monday, 11-23-20 at 9:00 a.m., an unknown suspect entered a residence through a rear window on the 700 block of **Southgate Avenue**. The house is undergoing a full remodel, and the suspect stole tools.

Commercial Burglaries

There were two commercial burglaries during the past week.

On Wednesday, 11-19-20 between 11:00 p.m. and 11:30 p.m., an unknown suspect broke into a laundry room of an apartment on the 400 block of **89th Street**, vandalized the coin operated washing machines and stole coins.

On Friday, 11-20-20 at approximately 1:45 a.m., an unknown suspect broke into the **Hope Lutheran Church** via a window and stole miscellaneous clothing items, snacks and money. This investigation is continuing.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were seven vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- Parking garage of 88 **Hillside Boulevard**—tools and two backpacks were taken from a 2016 Hyundai Veloster. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred between 4:30 p.m. on 11-17-20 and 5:03 a.m. on 11-18-20.

This private network ensures that only those who live in your neighborhood can join; users must go through a verification process.
