Try to get a good description of the person dumping, the location, the vehicle used to transport the debris, and if possible, the vehicle license plate number. If able, take pictures and videos of the dumping. **Keep a safe distance and do not engage with the violators.**

Illegal Dumping

What is Illegal Dumping?

Illegal Dumping is the act of improperly disposing waste at a location not permitted for disposal.

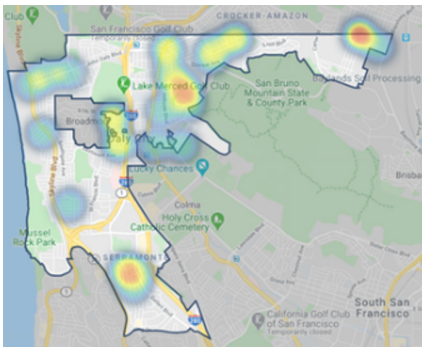
Removal of Illegal Dumping costs you money!

The daily removal of debris prevents 3-4 City staff from performing more important projects like sidewalk and street repairs, street sign replacement, and landscaping maintenance projects. Over 7,000 hours are spent every year on removal, costing taxpayers approximately \$300,000/year.

Your garbage rates are also impacted by the costs for Republic Services to remove and dispose of the illegally dumped items.

How does Illegal Dumping affect me?

Illegal Dumping has impacts on our community's health, safety, and even property values. The heat map below shows hotspot areas where our City is being littered with debris:

The iHelp app allows users to easily submit service requests through their smartphones with the touch of a button. Snap a photo and send it off! Requests are automatically routed to the correct City staff.
Public Works Staff or Republic Services will come out to collect the illegally dumped items.

Proper Disposal

On-Call Bulky Goods Collection



Did you know Daly City residents get one (1) On-Call Bulky Goods Collection annually at no cost to get rid of unwanted items for reuse, recycling or disposal. Accepted items include:

- Garbage** – Up to two cubic yards or the equivalent of 12 32-gallon sized garbage bags of bagged, boxed or bundled garbage, clothing, yard trimmings and other items.
- Bulky Items** – Up to two large items not exceeding 200 pounds each or 3 feet by 6 feet, including appliances, mattresses or furniture. Tree trunks or branches must not exceed 2 feet in diameter and 4 feet in length.

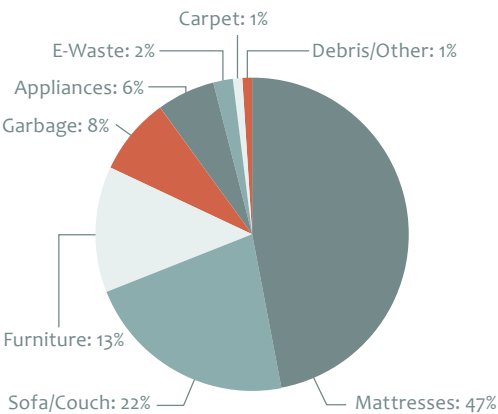
Can I place unwanted items on the sidewalk and label them “Free?”

No, this is considered Illegal Dumping per Daly City Municipal Code Chapter 8.32.

Got Household Hazardous Waste, like paint, household cleaners and insecticides?

San Mateo County offers a free Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) program to all residents in the County. It’s illegal and unsafe to dump HHW in the trash or down the drain. You can schedule an appointment to properly get rid of your HHW through the County’s year-round collection events. To make an appointment or for more information, visit smchealth.org/hhw.

Property owners’ responsibility

Property owners are responsible for Illegally Dumped items on their property.

To deter people from dumping on your property, you may install lights, a fence, or a camera, and/or hire a property manager.
