Renters who have been financially impacted by COVID-19 and need help with rent and utilities, both for past due and future payments, may be eligible for assistance through the CA COVID-19 Rent Relief Program.

## Daly City Stands United Against Hate During Recent Attacks on Asian American Community

On Saturday, March 22, the City Council in collaboration with community organizations held a rally to #StopAAPIHate at City Hall.

"Daly City is one of the most diverse cities in the Bay Area and we must acknowledge that these incidents should not lead to more violence, but create opportunities to unpack and understand the root causes of racism in our communities," said Vice Mayor Dr. Rod Daus-Magbual.

Daly City officials have been vocal in their condemnation of xenophobia, hate crimes and other violence against Asian Americans during the pandemic. "We have zero tolerance for racism, xenophobia and violence in Daly City and we will stand united against hate," said Mayor Juslyn Manalo.

Daly City was the first in the Bay Area to adopt a Resolution to denounce stigmatization, hateful racism and xenophobia during the pandemic in April 2020, in response to the sharp increase in discrimination against Asian Americans and immigrants.

Recent attacks have struck a chord with Daly City officials, because of the large percentage of immigrant and Asian citizens. The older adult population is also a rapidly growing demographic, with more than 22% of Daly City being over 60 years old.

Residents who witness or are victims of assault, such as deliberate coughing, physically threatening actions and physical violence, should report the incidents immediately by calling 9-1-1. - **Secure Document Shredding** - 3 banker size boxes per household.
- **E-waste Drop off** - TV's, cell phones, monitors, printers, computers, cables, lamps, small appliances, and more. No large appliances (ex: refrigerator), lighting, batteries, or business waste.
- **Mattress Recycling** - Limit 4 per household. Items cannot be severely damaged or soiled. No toppers, bed frames, or pillows.
- **Used Tire Take Back** - Limit 9 passenger or light truck tires, up to R19.5, with or without rims. No commercial tire, auto repair, or salvage business.

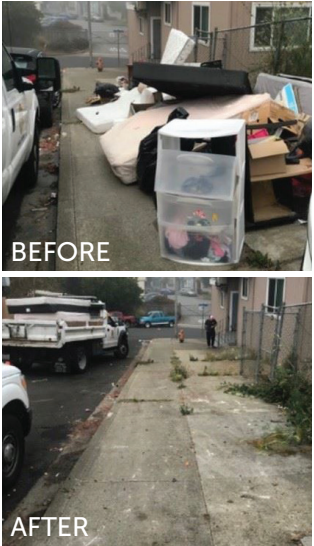

## New Hazard Pay Ordinance for Grocery and Drug Store Workers

On Monday, March 8, 2021, the Daly City Council unanimously adopted an urgency ordinance requiring hazard pay of \$5 per hour for grocery and drug store workers within City limits that meet certain criteria. The City Council of Daly City wants to ensure that these essential workers are adequately compensated for the hazards they face on the job.

Daly City's hazard pay ordinance applies to grocery stores and drug stores that are at least 10,000 square feet and located within Daly City, with 500 or more employees nationwide. Grocery stores are defined as devoting 10% or more of interior space to the sale of food products. The new hazard pay requirement applies to employees who perform at least two hours of work in a calendar week, are paid by the hour and qualify as employees entitled to payment of a minimum wage. The ordinance does not require hazard pay for managers or supervisors.

## Minimum Wage to Increase to \$15 in Daly City in 2021

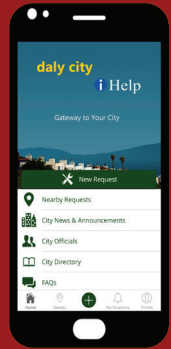
Beginning January 1, 2021, Daly City's local minimum wage of \$15 applies to all businesses within the geographic boundaries of Daly City and any employee working at least two or more hours per week. The minimum wage applies to all companies that have employees who work in Daly City. An employer may not use tips, or fringe benefits such as health insurance, vacation, sick leave or other benefits to offset or use as a credit towards the employer's obligation to pay the City's minimum wage.

Republic Services is contracted to collect and dispose of Bulky Goods illegally dumped on public streets and public right-of-ways within 2 calendar days of notification. Public Works Staff will provide additional support as needed. You can also submit requests for issues like potholes, graffiti and more.

## COVID-19 Vaccine Updates

Sign up for San Mateo County's COVID-19 vaccine notification system at [www.smchealth.org/covid-19-vaccination](http://www.smchealth.org/covid-19-vaccination) or the state's MyTurn at [myturn.ca.gov](http://myturn.ca.gov) to be notified when you are qualified for a vaccine and can schedule an appointment online. San Mateo County's clinics have begun to operate on regular schedules and many clinics will also be able to vaccinate eligible residents without pre-scheduled appointments for increased convenience.
