When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 06-07-22, at approximately 11:15 a.m., **Officer Jayme**, **Officer Yip**, and **Officer Greene** were dispatched to **CVS Pharmacy** on **Gellert Boulevard** on a report of a shoplift. The manager said he heard an alarm go off and saw a suspect exit the store. The suspect walked next to a dumpster, took off a blue jacket and gray mask he had been wearing, and discarded both items next to the dumpster. The suspect then walked across **Gellert Boulevard** and headed north. **Officer Greene** was able to locate the suspect. The manager was transported to the suspect's location and identified him as the subject who stole from **CVS**. The suspect had approximately \$500 worth of **CVS** merchandise in his backpack. A glass pipe and suspected rock cocaine were also found on the suspect. The suspect, a 43-year-old Redwood City resident, was arrested and booked for possession of drug paraphernalia, possession of a controlled substance, organized retail theft, shoplifting, and probation violation.

On Tuesday, 06-07-22, at approximately 5:30 p.m., **Officer Ticzon** was dispatched to **Hidden Hype** on a report of a theft. An employee stated that three suspects had entered the store. As one of the suspects spoke with the store employee, the other two suspects grabbed sweatshirts, valued at approximately \$2,000, and then all three ran out of the store. The first suspect was described as an Asian female, approximately 18-25 years old, 5'1" tall, approximately 170 pounds, and wearing a black and white sweatshirt, gray pants, and black and white shoes. The second suspect was described as a Black male, approximately 18-25 years old, 6' tall, approximately 220 pounds, wearing an all-black Nike tracksuit. The third suspect was described as a Black male, approximately 18-25 years old, 5'10" tall, approximately 180 pounds, and wearing a gray Nike sweatshirt, black pants, and white shoes. All three suspects wore black ski masks that covered their heads and faces. This investigation is continuing.

On Thursday, 06-09-22, at approximately 2:56 p.m., **Officer Ticzon** was dispatched to **Victoria's Secret** on a report of a theft. Two suspects took 50 pairs of bras and panties valued at approximately \$2,500. A store employee described the first suspect as a Black female with long black and burgundy hair and 18-22 years old. The store employee stated that the suspect told her not to touch her or she would punch her. Another employee described the second suspect as a Black female wearing a black bandana with flowers and a black hoodie and 18-22 years old.

Robberies

There were three robberies during the past week.

On Wednesday, 06-08-22, at approximately 11:45 a.m., **Officer Long** and **Officer Ortiz** were dispatched to **Dollar Tree** on **Mission Street** on a report of a shoplift. An employee stated that she saw a suspect pick up a gift bag and place frozen food, candy, chips, and drinks, valued at approximately \$20, inside the bag. The employee asked the suspect if he was going to pay for the items and the man became irate and said, "Fuck you," "I'll kill you," and "I'll stab you." The employee was scared and asked a store clerk to call 911. Once the suspect realized the clerk had called 911, he left the store, walking south on **Mission Street**. The next day, at 12:54 p.m., the store manager called and stated the suspect was currently in the store. The suspect was arrested and was found to have methamphetamine. The suspect also had a stolen soda and pair of red sunglasses, valued at approximately \$3, from **Dollar Tree**. The suspect, a 48-year-old San Francisco resident, was booked into jail for robbery and possession of a controlled substance.

On Thursday, 06-09-22, at approximately 1:45 a.m., three suspects entered a residence by ramming the door on the 400 block of **Citrus Avenue**. One of the suspects was described as 5'3" tall and wearing a black ski mask, black hat, black zippered sweatshirt, and all-black clothing. One of the suspects pointed a gun at the victim while the two others searched the residence. The suspects stole a gun, amplifiers, speaker, jewelry, and a passport, valued at approximately \$7,700. This investigation is continuing.

On Sunday, 06-12-22, at approximately 2:12 p.m., at the 600 block of **Hanover Street**, two suspects struck and kicked a victim, and took his cell phone.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Monday, 06-06-22, between 1:30 p.m. and 2:00 p.m., a suspect forced his way into a residence on the unit block of **Ocean Grove Avenue** by kicking in the door. The suspect took a safe containing jewelry, silver coins, passport, social security card, and house deed, valued at approximately \$30,000-\$40,000. The suspect also took car manuals and bank statements. The suspect was wearing a gray and green hooded sweatshirt, black pants, and white sneakers. The suspect left in a newer model white **Jeep Compass** SUV with a black rooftop and black wheels, traveling east on **Ocean Grove Avenue**.

Commercial Burglaries

There were two commercial burglaries during the past week.

On Wednesday, 06-08-22, at approximately 2:15 p.m., a suspect smashed the drive-through window of **Taco Bell** on **Mission Street**. The staff stated that there was no loss. It is unknown if the suspect ever made entry since the glass on the bottom of the window was still intact.

On Thursday, 06-09-22, between 5:30 p.m. and 6:25 p.m., a suspect broke into a locker in the men's locker room at the **Planet Fitness** facility. The subject stole house and car keys from the locker and then took the victim's 2013 **Nissan Juke**, which was parked in the parking lot. The victim's wallet containing \$20 cash, CA driver's license, a credit card, a debit card, and medical insurance card was in the vehicle. The suspect made fraudulent charges with the victim's credit and debit cards. The suspect who used the credit card was described as either a Hispanic or White female with very long blonde hair in a ponytail and wearing a green/blue tee shirt, ripped light blue jeans, black ankle high boots, and black glasses. On 06-10-22, the victim's car was recovered. This investigation is continuing.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were four vehicle burglaries reported during the past week.

- 100 block of **Escuela Drive** —Dell laptop bag containing a Dell laptop, documents, and makeup bag/kit were taken from a 2021 **Toyota Highlander**. The back window was broken. Occurred between 11:00 p.m. on 06-06-22 and 8:00 a.m. on 06-07-22.
- Unit block of **Olympic Way** —luggage containing clothing, wallet with credit cards, an iPhone7, iPhone 13, iPad, AirPods, \$100 cash, and Rayban sunglasses were taken from a 2022 **Mitsubishi Outlander**. The rear window was shattered. Occurred on 06-06-22 between 12:35 p.m. and 12:45 p.m. Later in the day, the clothing, luggage, credit cards, and iPhone 7 were found at **Niantic Avenue** and **South Parkview Avenue**.
- Unit block of **Thornton Beach Road** —luggage containing clothing and an iPad and a canvas bag containing several pieces of jewelry and hearing aids were taken from a 2022 **Mitsubishi Outlander**. The passenger side windows were broken. Occurred on 06-08-22 between 11:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. At approximately 2:43 p.m., the luggage and canvas bag were found at Westlake Park. All items but the jewelry and iPad were located.
- 100 block of **Santa Cruz Avenue** —cigarettes and CDs were taken from a 2005 **Scion XB**. The door was unlocked. Occurred on 06-10-22 at approximately 2:45 p.m. The victim was able to catch up to the suspect and took all his belongings back.

Stolen Vehicles

There were three vehicles stolen and one attempted vehicle stolen during the past week. Two vehicles were recovered.

- **Westmoor Avenue and Baldwin Avenue**—a 2007 **Honda Repsol** motorcycle. Occurred on 06-08-22 at 7:45 p.m. **Recovered by DCPD on 06-08-22.
- Parking lot of **Planet Fitness**—a 2013 **Nissan Juke**. Occurred on 06-09-22 between 5:30 p.m. and 6:25 p.m. **Recovered by DCPD on 06-10-22.
- Parking lot near **Target** at the **Serramonte Shopping Center**—a 2021 **Jeep Compass**. Occurred on 06-11-22 at approximately 3:55 p.m.

Miscellaneous

- There were 139 cases taken.
- There were 9 domestic disturbance cases reported.
- There were 7 cases involving an involuntary psychiatric hold.
- There were 2 malicious mischief/vandalism cases reported.

- There were 0 cases for public intoxication.
