On November 22, 2021, the Daly City Council unanimously adopted a Mandatory Organic Waste Disposal Reduction Ordinance requiring compliance with SB 1383 and entered into an agreement with the County of San Mateo Office of Sustainability for an Edible Food Recovery Program effective January 1, 2022.

The Daly City Public Library Associates (DCPLA) is proud to announce the launch of the 2022-23 Daly City Youth Poet Laureate program. In partnership with the National Youth Poet Laureate Program by Urban Word and Daly City Public Library, the program celebrates teen poets who live or attend school in Daly City and exhibit a commitment to artistic excellence, civic engagement, leadership, and social justice.

The Youth Poet Laureate receives:

- \$5,000 award
- VIP status to represent Daly City at community events between May 2022 and May 2023
- Publication of 5 of your poems in the National Youth Poet Laureate annual anthology by Penmanship Books

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Reside OR attend school in Daly City
- Be between the ages of 13 and 18 years old by the application deadline
- Serve as Laureate for the program year, May 2022-May 2023

To apply, submit 5 original pieces with your application by January 31, 2022 online at dcpla.org/youthpoetlaureate.

2021 YOUTH POET LAUREATE WINNER

Madeleine Hur won the first Daly City Inaugural Youth Poet Laureate Program in May 2021.

Madeleine is a current senior at Oceana High School in Daly City. Since winning the title, she has served as an ambassador to the literary arts at Daly City community events and has used her words to fight for social change and inspire young women.

Winter Safety Tips to Keep You and Your Family Safe



Candle Safety

- Blow out lit candles when you leave the room or go to bed.
- Use candle holders that are sturdy and will not tip over.
- Keep anything that could burn 1 foot away from lit candles.
- Keep matches and lighters out of children's reach in a locked cabinet.
- Keep children and pets away from lit candles.



Heating Safety

- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Make sure your fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room.
- Fireplace ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.



Winter Emergency Preparedness

- Have flashlights and battery-powered lighting ready to use during a power outage.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month.

Remember dumping is illegal in Daly City, and violators may receive an administrative citation ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000 per Daly City Municipal Code Sections 8.32.100, 8.32.110, and 8.32.120.

If you see dumping in progress, call the Police Department at (650) 992-1225. Try to get a good description of the person dumping, the location, the vehicle used to transport the debris, and if possible, the vehicle license plate number. If able, take pictures and videos of the dumping. Keep a safe distance and do not engage with the violators.

Holiday Tree Pickup Guidelines

Holiday tree collection will take place on regular service days beginning Monday, December 27, 2021. Please follow these collection guidelines when placing your tree out for collection:

- 🌲 Trees must be cut into 6 ft. sections.
- 🌲 Stands, lights, and decorations must be removed.
- 🌲 Place trees next to the yard waste cart for removal. Flocked trees will be collected but not recycled.

Multi-family residents should contact their property manager for more information regarding disposal or call Customer Service at (650) 756-1130 to arrange for pickup.

After January 28, 2022, you must cut up the tree to fit in your green Compost cart or call Customer Service at (650) 756-1130 to arrange for pickup.

COVID Booster Shots Available



All available COVID-19 vaccines, which includes Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson, have been authorized for a booster dose in the United States. Booster doses are available through all current vaccination channels.

Be Prepared for the Rainy Season



Sandbags are available free of charge to Daly City residents 24 hours a day, 7 days a week at the parking lot adjacent to the Water and Wastewater Resources Department at 153 Lake Merced Blvd. Limit 10 sandbags per resident, while supplies last. Make sure to only fill sandbags half way so they are not too heavy to lift and will track properly to divert water.

Sandbags are also available at the Public Works Corp Yard located at 798 Niantic Ave. Look for the bags near the garages. The corp yard is open 7am to 3:30pm, weekdays only.
