## Participate in Daly City's 2022 Summer Recycling Event!

Join Daly City's Summer Recycling Event on Saturday, July 30, from 9:30 AM to 12:30 PM for a citywide compost giveaway and secure document shredding event! The event will be held at City Hall Parking Lot 333 90th street Daly City, 94015. To participate, proof of Daly City residency is required. Please bring a driver's license or recent utility bill.

To participate in the compost giveaway, bring your own buckets, shovels and gloves. The compost limit is 0.5 cubic yards per household. For secure document shredding, you may bring bank statements, credit card offers, canceled checks, old medical records and any other personal info to be shredded onsite. Residents are limited to three banker-size boxes per household.

## Refuse Single-Use Plastics, Be Compost Enthusiastic!



As a Daly City community, we are working to do our part to reduce plastic waste. In September of 2021, the Daly City Council unanimously adopted a Disposable Food Service Ware Ordinance to address plastic pollution by eliminating the unnecessary distribution and use of single-use plastics. This Ordinance repeals and replaces Chapter 8.64 of the Daly City Municipal Code, and builds upon previous City regulations that prohibited food vendors from using polystyrene-based disposable food service ware. Reducing Plastic consumption is not only up to food vendors—everyone in our community can play a role.

The Ordinance will go into effect on October 1, 2022, with single-use accessories, like utensils, napkins, and straws needing to meet the below restrictions and requirements:

- Single-use accessories cannot be bundled
- Single-use accessories can only be provided by request and/or at dispensers that dispense one item at a time
- Single-use accessories can only be offered only at airports and drive-thrus
- Most single-use foodware must be made of compostable natural fiber, like paper and bamboo, instead of plastic
- Compostable plastic foodware (a.k.a. PLA, bioplastics) is not allowed (except for the lining of items)
- Larger single-use foodware (i.e., clamshells, cups, etc.) must be approved by an County of San Mateo entity (e.g., Biodegradable Products Institute, Compost Manufacturing Alliance, etc.)
- Wherever practicable, food facilities must provide reusable foodware in place of disposable foodware

## Safely Dispose of Your Household Hazardous Waste

The Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Program is hosting a drop-off event in Daly City on Saturday, September 10, 2022 and Saturday, December 10, 2022.

Accepted items include cleaning products, fertilizers and garden chemicals, pesticides, herbicides and rodenticides, solvents, flammable liquids, fluorescent lights (compact and tubes), paint thinner, acids/bases, aerosol cans, automotive supplies (car batteries, motor oil, oil filters, antifreeze, brake fluid), inks, and photo chemicals. All waste collected is reused, recycled, or stabilized for proper disposal to achieve zero waste and prevent items from going to the landfill and contaminating our water and soil. Commercial, radioactive, explosive, and medical waste is not prohibited.

To participate, schedule an appointment with San Mateo County's HHW Program at [linktr.ee/dalycity](http://linktr.ee/dalycity) or call (650) 372-6200. Once your appointment is confirmed, the drop-off location will be disclosed and you will be limited to 10 gallons or 50 pounds per appointment (per car load). ## Be Water Wise

As California continues to experience severe drought conditions, there has never been a more critical time to conserve Daly City water. Approximately half of the drinking water available to Daly City customers comes from the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission's Hetch Hetchy Regional Water System and the remaining drinking water is pumped from a groundwater aquifer within our City.

Currently, the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission is requesting that Daly City reduce its water usage by 11%. It is essential for Daly City water customers to continue to increase our efforts to conserve every drop of water to meet and exceed this goal.

The Daly City's Department of Water & Wastewater Resources has released the following update:

- Limit outdoor water use
- Limit landscape irrigation to no more than two days per week
- No irrigation between 10 AM and 6 PM
- Repair leaks as soon as possible
- No washing hard surfaces; sweep instead
- Empty all decorative water features and fountains
- Restaurants will only serve water upon request
- No vehicle washing except at facilities that recycle or recirculate water

## Fire Safe Your Property



As the weather starts to heat up, it is important to ensure that excess weeds, brush and high grass do not become a hazard to your property and neighboring properties. If you are a property owner, you are required to abate any overgrowth of foliage on or around your property. You are also required to check and remove other hazards such as stacked wood, discarded furniture or equipment, and debris in front, side or rear yards. Follow the tips below for managing tall grass and weeds:

- Mow your grass and cut or pull weeds taller than 12 inches
- Remove cuttings and leaf litter to avoid them being blown off your property on windy days
- Frequently remove dirt and soil dislodged from gopher holes in sidewalk areas and along the edges of lawns
- Schedule regular yard maintenance for your front and backyard
