When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

Residential Burglaries

There were two residential burglaries during the past week.

On Sunday, 10-16-22, at approximately 12:52 a.m., **Officer Premenko** was dispatched to the unit block of **Canterbury Avenue** on a report of a suspect who broke the front door. The suspect removed a window screen to the bathroom and proceeded to break a wooden panel on the front door. The suspect left after the victim called 911.

On Sunday, 10-16-22, at approximately 2:58 a.m., **Officer Premenko** was dispatched again to the unit block of **Canterbury Avenue**. The same suspect returned, put his hands through the broken panel on the front door, opened the door, and entered the residence. The suspect, a 29-year-old Daly City resident, and known to the victim was arrested and booked into jail for residential burglary.

Commercial Burglaries

There were no commercial burglaries during the past week.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were seven vehicle burglaries reported during the past week.

This private network ensures that only those who live in your neighborhood can join; users must go through a verification process.
