When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Wednesday, 12-14-22, at approximately 7:31 p.m., **Officer Kirsch** and **Officer McQuade** were dispatched to **Home Depot** on a report of a robbery. A loss prevention agent stated a subject came into the store and selected a plant, pliers, hammers, a flashlight, and a speaker. The suspect concealed all items, except the plant, in his duffel bag. The suspect paid for the plant and walked out of the store. The loss prevention agent stopped the suspect and asked him to relinquish the stolen merchandise, valued at approximately \$260. The suspect said he did not have any items. The suspect pushed the loss prevention agent out of his way so that he could leave with the stolen items. The suspect fled towards **John Daly Boulevard**. A Broadmoor police officer located the suspect with the duffel bag at a bus stop on **John Daly Boulevard** at **Park Plaza Drive**. The suspect, a 37-year-old San Francisco resident, was arrested and booked into jail for robbery and an outstanding warrant.

On Saturday, 12-17-22, at approximately 9:41 p.m., **Officer L. Reyes** was dispatched to **Macy's** on a report of a fight. **Macy's** loss prevention said three suspects entered the store, two selected numerous perfume bottles, and all three exited without paying. As loss prevention staff tried to stop the suspects, the group shifted to an employee entrance area, where one of the suspects tried to push two loss prevention agents down some stairs to escape. Two suspects left the scene; however, loss prevention was able to detain one suspect. The stolen perfume is valued at approximately \$2,046. Loss prevention recovered approximately \$796 of the \$2,046 worth of perfume that was stolen. Charges will be filed on the detained suspect for robbery and conspiracy to commit a crime. This investigation is continuing.

Residential Burglaries

There were no residential burglaries during the past week.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

On Wednesday, 12-14-22, at approximately 10:26 a.m., **Officer Hepler** and **Officer Gregorio** were dispatched to **Walgreens** on **Mission Street** on a report of a burglary. An employee stated that she saw a suspect who was wearing a black mask and a black hoodie (with the hood on) go to the fragrance aisle. The suspect broke the glass case, placed fragrances valued at approximately \$6,900 into a duffel bag, and left the store. This investigation is continuing.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were two vehicle burglaries reported during the past week.

- 600 block of **South Mayfair Avenue**—a backpack containing a MacBook Air and soccer cleats was taken from a 2014 **Toyota Prius**. The catalytic converter was also stolen. The back passenger window was smashed. Occurred between 9:30 p.m. on 12-12-22 and 10:30 a.m. on 12-13-22.
- 300 block of **Washington Street**—a lock was taken from a 2016 **Ford F450**. The driver's side window was broken. Occurred on 12-15-22 between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. **Online report.

Stolen Vehicles

There were three vehicles stolen and one attempted stolen vehicle during the past week. One vehicle was recovered.

- 100 block of **Ardendale Drive**—a 2014 **Infiniti Q50**. Occurred between 7:00 p.m. on 12-14-22 and 7:30 a.m. on 12-15-22.
- 900 block of **Hanover Street**—a 2018 **Chevrolet Camaro**. Occurred between 8:30 a.m. on 12-17-22 and 9:00 a.m. on 12-18-22. **Recovered on 12-18-22 by the victim's brother who notified DCPD.
- 900 block of **Saint Francis Boulevard**—a 2016 **Mazda 6**. Occurred between 7:00 p.m. on 12-17-22 and 12:30 p.m. on 12-18-22.
- 3100 block of **Geneva Avenue**—a 2002 **Chevrolet Silverado**. Occurred on 12-17-22, at approximately 7:27 p.m. The suspect entered the running vehicle and attempted to drive away. The victim was able to remove the keys from the ignition. The suspect tried to flee, but the victim was able to detain him until officers arrived. The suspect, a 25-year-old San Francisco transient, was arrested and booked into jail for the attempted stolen vehicle.
