



# Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

## Robberies

There was one robbery during the past week.

On Friday, 04-21-23, at approximately 8:04 p.m., officers were dispatched to **Macy's** on a report of a robbery. An asset protection agent stated that a suspect entered Macy's, concealed multiple jackets worth approximately \$1,500 into a black duffel bag, and exited the store. Outside Macy's, asset protection agents identified themselves to the suspect. The suspect took out a knife and waved it back and forth while standing a couple feet from the asset protection agents. Both asset protection agents moved out of the suspect's pathway. The suspect went down a flight of stairs, entered a vehicle, and drove away. Through investigation, on 04-23-23, the suspect, a 36-year-old San Francisco resident, was arrested and booked into jail for robbery and other offenses.

## Residential Burglaries

There were no residential burglaries during the past week.

## Commercial Burglaries

There were three commercial burglaries during the past week.

On Wednesday, 04-19-23, at approximately 3:17 a.m., two suspects went into a garage on the 400 block of **A Street** and stole an e-bike. The suspects entered the garage in a Chevrolet Camaro. The male suspect exited the driver's seat and cut off the bike lock with a bolt cutter. He rode off with the e-bike while the other suspect, a female passenger, entered the driver's seat and drove off. The male suspect was described as possibly Hispanic, 25-30 years old, 160 pounds, had short hair, and wearing a black sweater and black pants. The female suspect was described as possibly Hispanic, 25-30 years old, 160 pounds, and wearing glasses, a black long-sleeve shirt, and blue flower pants.

On Friday, 04-21-23, at approximately 4:50 a.m., officers were dispatched to **Primo Pizza on Mission Street** on a report of an alarm call. The owner of the business stated that he was not expecting anyone to be at the business. Upon arrival, the front door was not secured, and the suspect(s) took approximately \$1,400 from the cash register and left.

On Saturday, 04-22-23, at approximately 7:49 a.m., two suspects were seen around an apartment complex's mailbox area and laundry room on the unit block of **Hill Street**. At 9:30 a.m., the property manager discovered the washing machine's coin box was broken into, and all the coins were missing. In video surveillance, it can be seen that the female suspect took out an object from her pocket and used it to maneuver the doorknob to the laundry room and was able to open the locked door. The female suspect then lets in a male suspect. The male suspect is seen entering and leaving the laundry room a couple of times before both suspects finally leave. The female suspect was initially seen holding a tan envelope, and when she left the laundry room, she was no longer holding the envelope. At 10:35 a.m., an officer located the female suspect at the Colma BART station. The female suspect, a 28-year-old San Francisco resident, was arrested and booked into jail for burglary and mail theft.

## Vehicle Burglaries

There were seven vehicle burglaries and one attempted vehicle burglary during the past week.

- **Elmwood Drive and South Mayfair Avenue**—an iPhone charger was taken from a 2007 **Kia Spectra**. The rear passenger side window was smashed. Occurred between an unknown time and date and 11:55 a.m. on 04-17-23.
- Unit block of **Oakridge Drive**—nothing was taken from a 2020 **BMW X2**. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred between 9:00 a.m. on 04-19-23 and 6:45 a.m. on 04-20-23.
- Unit block of **Oakridge Drive**—garage door openers and wallet with gift cards were taken from a 2020 **Ford Edge**. Unknown method of entry. Occurred between 8:00 p.m. on 04-19-23 and 9:45 a.m. on 04-20-23.
- Parking garage on the unit block of **Poncetta Drive**—nothing was taken from a 2022 **Jeep Grand Cherokee**. The driver's side window was smashed. Occurred between 7:30 p.m. on 04-20-23 and 6:00 a.m. on 04-21-23.
- Unit block of **Southgate Avenue**—sunglasses were taken from a 2018 **Hyundai Santa Fe**. The rear passenger side window was smashed. Occurred between 8:00 p.m. on 04-20-23 and 6:00 a.m. on 04-21-23. This is the same vehicle mentioned below in the Stolen Vehicles section.
- **Lake Merced Drive and Coronado Avenue**—tools were taken from a 1997 **Chevrolet Silverado**. The rear passenger side window was smashed. Occurred between 11:00 p.m. on 04-21-23 and 12:00 p.m. on 04-22-23.
- 200 block of **School Street**—a watch, two chargers, and a bracelet with charms were taken from a 2017 **Chevrolet Camaro**. The front passenger side window was broken. Occurred between 11:30 p.m. on 04-22-23 and 3:45 a.m. on 04-23-23.

- 200 block of **San Pedro Road**—an attempted vehicle burglary from a 2014 **Scion XD**. A car pick tool and a long metal car pry tool was used in an attempt to pry the driver's door open. Occurred on 04-23-23 at approximately 12:22 p.m. The suspect fled and was located at **San Pedro Road** and **Mission Street**. The suspect, a 40-year-old Daly City resident, was arrested and booked into jail for attempted auto burglary and possession of burglary tools.

## Stolen Vehicles

There were three stolen vehicles and two attempted stolen vehicles during the past week. One vehicle was recovered.

- Unit block of **Poncetta Drive**—an attempted theft of a 2020 **Hyundai Elantra**. Occurred between an unknown time and date and 9:30 a.m. on 04-21-23. \*\*Online report.
