D	66411.7(e)(3) Parking. 1. Units that were occupied by a tenant in the past three years cannot be altered or demolished. Any units rented by lower income households in the past five years that are to be demolished must be replaced with deed-restricted lower income units as provided under the Housing Crisis Act of 2019. (G.C. Section 66300(d).)
2. This item is needed primarily in counties; if in a city that is partially urbanized, can be deleted.
