When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Robberies

There were three robberies during the past week.

On Thursday, 02-29-24, at approximately 7:40 p.m., on the 500 block of **King Drive**, a victim said an unknown suspect grabbed his car key fob, entered the passenger seat of the suspect vehicle, a dark gray four-door sedan, and fled. The victim described the suspect as a Black male, approximately 24 years old, 6’1” tall, 155 pounds, wearing a black ski mask and black puffy jacket.

On Friday, 03-01-24, at approximately 5:04 p.m., an officer was dispatched to **Hollister** at the **Serramonte Shopping Center** on a report of a shoplifter. A store asset protection employee saw a suspect enter the store, select a gray sweater worth approximately \$44, conceal the sweater inside a backpack, and exit the store. Outside the store, asset protection employees tried to stop the suspect; however, the suspect resisted and threatened to assault the asset protection employees. Eventually, both asset protection employees were able to detain the suspect until police arrived. The suspect, a 21-year-old San Francisco resident, was arrested and booked into jail for robbery.

On Tuesday, 02-27-24, at approximately 2:05 a.m., near the north entrance doors of **Lucky’s** on **Mission Street**, a suspect pointed a gun at an employee who was arriving for work and demanded the employee’s wallet. The victim stated that he reached into his pockets, grabbed only his keys, and banged on the doors of the building in hopes that someone would let him inside. Subsequently, the suspect shot the victim in the foot. The suspect then ran, entered a silver Toyota Avalon, and sped off. The victim described the suspect as a Black male, 25 to 30 years old, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt with the hood pulled over his head and a black ski mask. This investigation is continuing.

Residential Burglaries

There were no residential burglaries during the past week.

Commercial Burglaries

There were four commercial burglaries during the past week.

On Wednesday, 02-28-24, at approximately 2:00 a.m., **Pump Repair Service Company**, located on **Allan Street**, was a victim of a burglary by suspects forcing entry through a garage door. The suspects took an electronic alignment tool and pliers, all valued at approximately \$2,600. The suspect vehicles are described as a black or dark-colored Honda Civic and Ford F250.

On Wednesday, 02-28-24, at approximately 5:30 p.m., officers were dispatched to **Lucky's** on **Mission Street** on a report of a burglary. The head clerk said an unknown suspect used a hammer to smash the liquor cabinet glass, took \$800 worth of tequila, and fled through the emergency exit.

On Wednesday, 02-28-24, between 2:00 p.m. and 3:10 p.m., unknown suspect(s) entered **Planet Fitness** on **Junipero Serra Boulevard** and broke into a locker. The suspect(s) took a wallet containing a social security card, AAA card, a health plan card, a credit card, two debit cards, and family photos. A suspect attempted to use the credit card and one of the debit cards at a retailer. The suspect selected \$1,567 worth of merchandise and attempted to pay with both cards. The credit card was declined, but the debit card was charged approximately \$107. The suspect left without any merchandise. This suspect was described as a heavysset male with facial hair wearing glasses, a blue denim button shirt with a white tee shirt underneath, blue jeans, and black and white shoes. This investigation is continuing.

On Saturday, 03-02-24, between 4:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m., an unknown suspect pried open the back door of **Ming Yuan**, a restaurant located on **Southgate Avenue**, and stole a cash register containing \$600. This investigation is continuing.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were four vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- 600 block of **Sylvan Street**—unknown if anything was taken from a 2020 **Ford Transit Connect**. The driver's side window was shattered. Occurred between an unknown time and date and 3:45 a.m. on 02-26-24.
- Parking garage on the 2000 block of **Junipero Serra Boulevard**—copper plumbing fittings and brass valves were taken from a 2022 **Ford F350**. The driver's side utility box was pried open. Occurred on 02-26-24 between 10:40 a.m. and 11:20 a.m. **Online report.
