When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Robberies

There was one robbery during the past week.

On Saturday, 03-23-24, at approximately 3:15 a.m., an officer was flagged down at the bus stop located on **Mission Street** and **John Daly Boulevard**. The victim reported that two suspects, one wearing a red jacket and the other wearing a gray jacket, had just attempted to rob him. As the officer spoke with the victim, the officer noticed a suspect wearing a face mask and a red puffy jacket walking west on Los Olivos Avenue directly behind the bus stop. As the officer approached, the officer noticed the suspect underneath a vehicle. The suspect was instructed to get out from underneath the vehicle. Meanwhile, a second person approached and stated that the suspect was his friend. Upon inspection under the vehicle, the officer found a replica handgun with an orange tip, a black pocketknife, and a pair of black gloves. Another officer, conducting a check of the area, had located a third person and the suspect wearing the gray jacket. The victim identified these suspects as the individuals who had attempted to rob him. The suspect wearing the red jacket, an 18-year-old San Francisco resident, was arrested and booked into jail for attempted robbery, conspiracy to commit a crime, and contributing to the delinquency of a minor. The suspect wearing the gray jacket, a 15-year-old Oakland resident, was arrested and booked into the Youth Services Center for attempted robbery and conspiracy to commit a crime.

Residential Burglaries

There were no residential burglaries during the past week.

Commercial Burglaries

There were six commercial burglaries during the past week.

On Thursday, 03-21-24, at approximately 11:08 p.m., officers were dispatched to **Sherwin Williams** on the 7200 block of **Mission Street** in response to a glass break alarm. The manager stated that the front door had been forced open by an unknown suspect. Upon entry, the suspect checked the registers, which were already open and empty. Subsequently, the suspect grabbed a rolling toolbox carrier and a vacuum before exiting. Both items are valued at approximately \$600. The manager described the suspect as a White male wearing glasses, a black ski mask, a black hooded sweatshirt, blue latex gloves, black pants, black shoes, and a blue jacket tied around his waist with a multi-colored shopping bag. This investigation is continuing.

On Friday, 03-22-24, between 3:28 a.m. and 5:03 a.m., **Target** at the **Westlake Shopping Center** was the victim of a burglary by an unknown suspect, who pried open the rear gate. The suspect stole approximately \$440 worth of Stanley cups and fled north on Lake Merced Boulevard. The suspect was described as an adult male with curly hair, wearing a hat, gloves, and possibly a North Face jacket.

Between Sunday, 03-24-24, at approximately 9:00 p.m., and Monday, 03-25-24, at approximately 9:00 a.m., **four** apartment complexes on the 400 block of **87th Street** had their mailboxes forced open by a suspect. The property manager stated that it is unknown whether the suspect took any mail.

Vehicle Burglaries

There was one vehicle burglary during the past week.

- 200 block of **Byrne Street**—the title and registration were taken from a 2000 **GMC 6500**. The door handle and lock assembly were missing from the passenger side door. Occurred between an unknown time on 03-20-24 and 8:00 a.m. on 03-24-24.

Stolen Vehicles

There were five stolen vehicles during the past week. Four vehicles were recovered.

- Unit block of **Poncetta Drive**—a 2018 **Kia Rio**. Occurred on 03-18-24 at approximately 3:30 p.m. **Recovered by Oakland PD on 03-18-24.
- **Martin Street** and **Oriente Street**—a 2019 **Lexus IS300**. Occurred between 11:30 p.m. on 03-18-24 and 5:30 a.m. on 03-19-24.
- **Alta Vista Way** and **Caroline Way**—a 2016 **Lexus IS350**. Occurred on 03-21-24 at approximately 5:36 a.m. **Recovered by Oakland PD on 03-24-24.
- **Crocker Avenue** and **Rampart Way**—a 2012 **Ford F350**. Occurred between 7:00 p.m. on 03-21-24 and 4:00 a.m. on 03-22-24 **Recovered by San Leandro PD on 03-22-24.
- 300 block of **Price Street**—a 2019 **Chevrolet Cruze**. Occurred on 03-23-24 between 4:00 p.m. and 4:20 p.m. **Recovered by SFPD on 03-26-24.

- There were 157 cases taken.

- There were 19 domestic disturbance cases reported.
- There were 7 cases involving an involuntary psychiatric hold.
- There were 13 malicious mischief/vandalism cases reported.
- There were 0 cases for public intoxication.
- There were 2 hit-and-run collisions reported.
- There were 16 narcotics-related cases taken.

This private network ensures that only those who live in your neighborhood can join; users must go through a verification process. Neighbors ask each other for business recommendations; help in locating missing pets; discuss relevant local government issues; or connect for other reasons. It is very easy to sign up. I like the fact that the site verifies users by addresses, and it won't allow people to access a neighborhood if they don't live there.
