When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Robberies

There was one robbery during the past week.

On Tuesday, 04-02-24, at approximately 9:43 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the unit block of **Alp Avenue** on a report of a carjacking. The victim stated that she had entered her vehicle, a 2008 Honda Civic, when an unknown suspect opened the door and said to her in Spanish, “What do you have on you?” The victim replied, “I don’t have anything.” The suspect then proceeded to grab a \$600 necklace from her neck and punched the victim in the face four times. The suspect produced a knife and ordered the victim to exit the vehicle. Fearing for her safety, the victim complied. The suspect then entered the victim’s vehicle and drove off toward Mission Street. The victim described the suspect as a male adult, approximately 5’7” to 5’8” tall, 160 pounds, with a high-pitched voice. On 04-03-24, the vehicle was recovered by the Vallejo Police Department. This investigation is continuing.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Thursday, 04-04-24, between 9:30 a.m. and 10:20 a.m., a residence on the unit block of **Woodland Avenue** was burglarized by unknown suspect(s) who shattered the rear glass sliding door. The victims had over \$200,000 worth of jewelry, \$700 in cash, and \$500 worth of tools stolen. This investigation is continuing.

Commercial Burglaries

There were no commercial burglaries during the past week.

Vehicle Burglaries

There was one vehicle burglary during the past week.

- Unit block of **Crocker Avenue**—snacks and an envelope containing insurance documents were taken from a 2015 **Dodge Durango**. The method of entry is unknown. The incident occurred on 04-01-24 at approximately 7:43 a.m. Two victims noticed a suspect in the rear of their vehicle and called the police. A few minutes later, the suspect was located at a bus stop. The suspect, a 42-year-old transient, was arrested and booked into jail for auto burglary and other charges.

Stolen Vehicles

There were six stolen vehicles and two attempted stolen vehicles during the past week. Four vehicles were recovered.

- **Guttenberg Street** and **Bellevue Avenue**—a 1999 **Honda Civic**. Occurred between 11:00 p.m. on 04-04-24 and 11:00 a.m. on 04-05-24.
- **Chester Street** and **Abbot Avenue**—a 2006 **Saturn Vue**. Occurred on 04-05-24 between 1:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. **Recovered by DCPD on 04-05-24.
- Unit block of **Windsor Drive**—a 2016 **Lexus IS200T**. Occurred between 3:00 p.m. on 04-05-24 and 6:19 p.m. on 04-06-24. **Recovered by Richmond PD on 04-09-24.
- Unit block of **Southridge Way**—a 2022 **Dodge Ram**. Occurred between 10:45 p.m. on 04-06-24 and 4:15 a.m. on 04-07-24.
- 3200 block of **San Jose Avenue**—a 2012 **Hyundai Elantra**. Occurred between 6:00 p.m. on 04-07-24 and 10:00 p.m. on 04-08-24. **Recovered by SFPD on 04-09-24.
- 400 block of **Evergreen Avenue**—an attempted theft of a 2013 **Lexus GS350**. Occurred on 04-01-24 at approximately 10:32 p.m.
- 300 block of **Accacia Street**—an attempted theft of a 2012 **Hyundai Elantra**. Occurred on 04-03-24 at approximately 8:30 p.m.

Have you signed up to receive these alerts? This alert is a free digital communication system used by emergency management agencies and first responders to send emergency alerts, notifications, and updates to portable digital devices. In an emergency situation, an alert will be sent by San Mateo County authorized personnel, and you will receive messages on your cell phone or mobile device. Nextdoor.com is a free private social networking website for your neighborhood. This private network ensures that only those who live in your neighborhood can join; users must go through a verification process.

Neighbors ask each other for business recommendations; help in locating missing pets; discuss relevant local government issues; or connect for other reasons. It is very easy to sign up. I like the fact that the site verifies users by addresses, and it won't allow people to access a neighborhood if they don't live there. Please note: The City of Daly City and/or the Police Department cannot see what residents post—we are only allowed to post information.
