When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Robberies

There were no robberies during the past two weeks.

Residential Burglaries

There were no residential burglaries during the past two weeks.

Commercial Burglaries

There were two commercial burglaries during the past two weeks.

On Saturday, 05-25-24, between 6:53 a.m. and 7:00 a.m., **Infinity & Co.** at the **Serramonte Center** was a victim of a burglary by unknown suspects. One suspect managed to break open a cabinet but appeared to be startled and fled the store without taking anything. This suspect was holding a yellow crowbar and wearing a white hat, face cover, black pants, gloves, and shoes. The suspects left the mall in a white Nissan NV 2500 HD van. This investigation is continuing.

On Sunday, 05-26-24, at approximately 11:00 p.m., **Giannini's Auto Body**, located on the 400 block of **Talbert Street**, was a victim of a burglary. The suspects took approximately \$100,000-\$200,000 worth of equipment. A 2011 Chevrolet CK 4500 (the same vehicle mentioned below in the Stolen Vehicle section) was also stolen and later recovered by the Martinez Police Department. The owner described the first suspect as a

White male wearing a mask, and the second suspect, of unknown race, was also wearing a mask. This investigation is continuing.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were ten vehicle burglaries during the past two weeks.

- Parking lot of **Serramonte Center** near **Dick's Sporting Goods** and **Crunch Fitness**—three gym bags containing clothes, makeup, workout gloves, a workout band, a lift belt, and a work badge were taken from a 2022 **Toyota RAV4**.
